- 1. <u>Name</u>: State full name (include any former names used).
- 2. <u>Address</u>: List current office address. If city and state of residence differs from your place of employment, please list the city and state where you currently reside.
- 3. **<u>Birthplace</u>**: State year and place of birth.
- 4. **<u>Resume</u>**: Provide a copy of your current resume.
- 5. <u>Education</u>: List in reverse chronological order each college, law school, or any other institution of higher education attended and indicate for each the dates of attendance, whether a degree was received, and the date each degree was received.
- 6. <u>Employment Record</u>: List in reverse chronological order all governmental agencies, business or professional corporations, companies, firms, or other enterprises, partnerships, institutions or organizations, non-profit or otherwise, with which you have been affiliated as an officer, director, partner, proprietor, or employee since graduation from college, whether or not you received payment for your services. Include the name and address of the employer and job title or description.
- 7. <u>Military Service and Draft Status</u>: Identify any service in the U.S. Military, including dates of service, branch of service, rank or rate, serial number (if different from social security number) and type of discharge received, and whether you have registered for selective service.
- 8. <u>Honors and Awards</u>: List any scholarships, fellowships, honorary degrees, academic or professional honors, honorary society memberships, military awards, and any other special recognition for outstanding service or achievement.
- 9. <u>Bar Associations</u>: List all bar associations or legal or judicial-related committees, selection panels or conferences of which you are or have been a member, and give the titles and dates of any offices which you have held in such groups.

10. Bar and Court Admission:

a. List the date(s) you were admitted to the bar of any state and any lapses in membership. Please explain the reason for any lapse in membership.

b. List all courts in which you have been admitted to practice, including dates of admission and any lapses in membership. Please explain the reason for any lapse in membership. Give the same information for administrative bodies that require special admission to practice.

- a. - b. Supply a copy of transcripts or recordings of all speeches or talks delivered by you including commencement speeches, remarks, lectures, panel discussions, conferences, political speeches, and question-and-answer sessions. Include the date and place where they were delivered, and readily available press reports

about the speech or talk. If you do not have a copy of the speech or a transcript or recording of your remarks, give the name and address of the group before whom the speech was given, the date of the speech, and a summary of its subject matter. If you did not speak from a prepared text, furnish a copy of any outline or notes from which you spoke.

- 14. **<u>Recusal</u>**: If you are or have been a judge, identify the basis by which you have assessed the necessity or propriety of recusal. 18. Legal Activities:

Describe fully the nature of your participation in these activities. - b. If you lack significant trial experience, describe the experiences or special skills you possess which you believe qualify you to serve as a United States District

- 19. <u>**Teaching**</u>: What courses have you taught? For each course, state the title, the institution at which you taught the course, the years in which you taught the course, and describe briefly the subject matter of the course and the major topics taught. If you have a syllabus of each course, provide a copy.
- 20. <u>Outside Commitments During Court Service</u>: Do you have any plans, commitments, or agreements to pursue outside employment, with or without compensation, during your service with the court? If so, explain.

21. Potential Conflicts of Interest:

- a. Identify the family members or other persons, parties, categories of litigation, and financial arrangements that are likely to present potential conflicts-of-interest when you would first assume the position to which you are applying. Explain how you would address any such conflict if it were to arise.
- b. Explain how you will resolve any potential conflict of interest, including the procedure you will follow in determining these areas of concern.
- 22. <u>Pro Bono Work</u>: An ethical consideration under Canon 2 of the American Bar Association's Code of Professional Responsibility calls for "every lawyer, regardless of professional prominence or professional work load, to find some time to participate in serving the disadvantaged." Describe what you have done to fulfill these responsibilities, listing specific instances and the amount of time devoted to each.
- 23. <u>Employment History</u>: State whether you have ever been discharged from employment for any reason or have ever resigned after being informed that your employer intended to discharge you.
- 24. **<u>Bankruptcy and Tax Information</u>**: Information under this heading must be provided for yourself and your spouse.
 - a. Have you and your spouse filed and paid all taxes (federal, state and local) as of the date of your nomination? Indicate if you filed "married filing separately."
 - b. Have you ever made any back tax payments? If so, indicate if you have made any back tax payments, and provide full details.
 - c. Has a tax lien or other collection procedure(s) ever been instituted against you or your spouse by federal, state, or local authorities? If so, provide full details.
 - d. Have you or your spouse ever been the subject of any audit, investigation, or inquiry for federal, state, or local taxes? If so, provide full details.

- e. Have you or your spouse ever declared bankruptcy? If so, provide full details.
- f. Are there any unsatisfied judgments against you, or are you in default in any way in the performance or discharge of any duty or obligation imposed upon you by decree or order of any court (including any orders for child and spousal support)? If so, state the full details.
- g. Have you ever been delinquent on any debts, including debts arising from defaults on Federally-guaranteed or State-guaranteed or insured loans such as student loans or home mortgages? If so, state the following: the date and name of agency issuing the loan, the date of default, and the final disposition of the default, including any legal action taken.

25. Past Investigations and Complaints:

- a. - 31. <u>References</u>: Provide three (3) references in support of your application.
- 32. <u>Position</u>: State the judgeship for which you are applying in the Northern District of Indiana.

Note: Once a candidate is under consideration by the President, the candidate will be required to complete a comprehensive background investigation, full financial disclosure, and answer a series of additional questions for the Senate Judiciary Committee regarding his or her fitness for judicial office.
